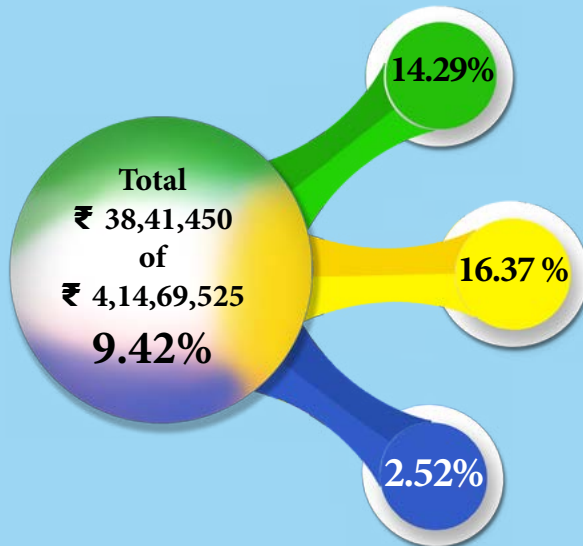

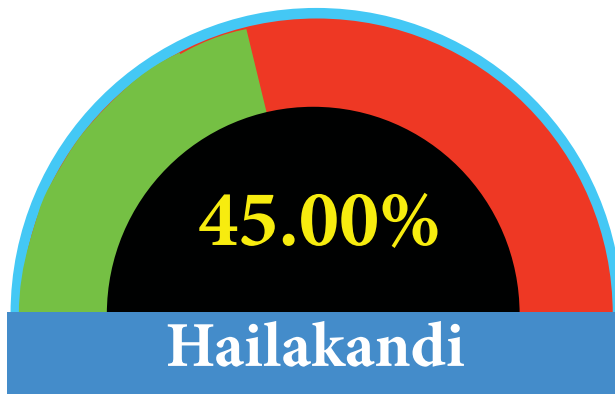

Shilpi, in Bengali means 'artist'. An artist presumably has the capacity to engage with people in different forms; and if the cause is for a greater interest of the public then it invites the attention of the authority. We do not know, whether she is an artist in traditional meaning or not, but Ms. Shilpi Sharma, a resident of Algapur Gaon Panchayat, Hailakandi district, is making a huge difference in the lives of many by her endless efforts in taking Neer Nirmal Pariyojana to each and every house of her GP. Shilpi had completed her graduation and worked as



tor and by proving her worth she was also selected as a Community Mobilizer. Unfortunately, she was the only person working in her GP as the other individual who was selected dropped out soon after seeing the hardships of the job. But Shilpi took it in her stride to accomplish the many objectives of the project. Also, provision of safe water in her area under NNP was an important aspect for her as her husband had also suffered and died due to the unavailability of the same.

Shilpi alone has achieved 46% collection of community contribution from over 800 households in a very short span. Understanding the complex political dynamics of Hailakandi, this is a remarkable achievement for the DPMU and Shilpi. This achievement also demonstrates her involvement with her community and their cooperation in her journey of earning a life of respect and dignity.

True to her name, Shilpi is an artist who has carved a new image of cohesion and solidarity in bringing safe water to her GP. Fondly called Shilpi Di by her co-mobilizers, Shilpi is an inspiration and has earned many accolades for her contribution to the project.
