








A Step towards SWACHHATA

Solid Liquid Waste Management (SLWM) is one of the major components under Neer Nirmal Pariyojana (NNP). NNP is an initiative with a new ray of hope in solving the issues of waste management in the rural areas. With an idea of a holistic approach towards waste management, DPMU Sivasagar is working towards achieving a Swachh Sivasagar starting with the project Blocks of Amguri and Gaurisagar.



As per the Baseline Survey under NNP, it was found that 33.26% of the households threw away their solid wastes out in the open or outside their yards

and 28.79% burned their household solid waste. These practices are potentially harmful and hence the DPMU is working towards providing improved mechanisms

of waste disposal to the community.

T o start with, D P M U Sivasgar has been organizing various awareness



programs with the communities on the importance of waste segregation. A number of such programs have been organized in schools, aganawadis and habitations with support from the Gaon Panchayat Water and Sanitation Committee (GPWSC) in the project GPs of Amguri and Gaurisagar Blocks. Also, the community is oriented on other health and hygiene issues such as use of toilets, hand washing, source reduction and the concepts of the 4Rs – Reduce, Reuse, Recycle & Recover.
